### **ENVIRONMENTAL**

Attention all boaters: we have had significant rainfall that has caused the lake levels to rise dramatically. When the water level is high (you can tell when you pass the dam that the water level is high by the amount of water spilling over the dam). Please watch your wake. We should always be cognizant of our wakes but with high water your wake will cause property damage. Any property damage caused by a wake is the boat owner's responsibility. After some heavy rains last summer and the year before I watched boats riding

up and down the lake and the wakes were splashing over onto peoples properties. This occurs mostly on the South Shore RD side of the lake. Please be aware of your wake.

All lakefront owners, please put some form of identification on your belongings that are near the water. I have rescued canoes, tables, chairs etc that have been blown into the lake. Most have no ID so they just sit on my property until someone happens to see them. This goes for life jacket, beachballs, water toys, boats, canoes, and kayaks.

The grant to clean up the Paulinskill was approved. I don't have a date for the clean up yet but it should be in June. We need as many volunteers as possible for this event. It would be a great community service project for students. I will keep everyone posted as to the date and time. Enjoy the lake this summer
